Name of Project : Development and Improvement of Indonesian Aids to Navigation Project

1. The Government of the Republic of Indonesia has received a loan from the Economic Development Cooperation Fund (EDCF) of The Republic of Korea towards the cost of the Development and Improvement of Indonesian Aids to Navigation Project (hereinafter "AtoN Project") and intends to apply part of the proceeds for the estimated cost for consultancy services is US\$ 7,214,00.
2. The main Work Scope of the project ;
 - A. Basic and Detailed Design / Preparation of Bidding Documents.
 - B. Contractor Selection (Bidding, Bid Evaluation, Contract Negotiation and Contract Signing).
 - C. Supervision on project implementation.
 - D. Training.
3. The period of these services is 34 (Thirty four) months with estimated input of 711 MM (Man Month) of the international and national experts.
4. The AtoN Project consists of architecture part (a) and ICT part (b,c): (a) AtoN Structure Construction (Lighthouse tower: 8 Sites, Light beacon: 95 Sites) , (b) Electrical and Optical System, (c) AIS/RMCS (AISs for 103 sites, A centralized type of RMCS)

Expression of interest must be register through the timeline procurement latest by July, 12- **August 02, 2021** and the Document of the Expression of Interest must be submitted through the timeline procurement latest by **August 03, 2021** – August 26, 2021.

But we kept knocking at the door and kept going until today we knocked it down and entered." Messi could have wrapped up the win two minutes from time but slipped when clean through with only Ederson to beat. "We have to be big enough to recognize [the defeat] regardless of how painful and difficult it is," said Brazil coach Tite.

In a frantic start, Argentina's burly enforcer Nicolas Otamendi was quickly in with his first foul while Brazilian midfielder Fred picked up the first booking after just three minutes for a studs-up lunge at Gonzalo Montiel.

Brazil were unchanged from their semifinal win over Peru while Scaloni made five altera-

pair of defenders. The brutal nature of the early challenges could be seen on the players' kits, with Neymar sporting ripped shorts and Lucas Paqueta being left with a hole in his sock following an intervention by Otamendi.

Argentina played with aggression and commitment, but no lack of quality with Di Maria tormenting Brazil's left back Renan Lodi, who probably should have cut out De Paul's pass for the winger's goal.

Di Maria had a shot from 20 yards blocked while Messi fired just wide following a 40-yard run.

Brazil struggled to create anything of note and even when they had a free kick from shooting range, Neymar could not beat the wall.

When the hosts did finally maintain some pressure late in the first half, Everton's deflected strike bobbled though to goal-

It was playing into Argentina's hands as they looked to run down the clock and hold onto their slender lead.

"Only one team wanted to play. It's a trap we knew about. That's not an excuse," complained Brazil captain Thiago Silva.

"It's difficult to play such a stop-start match."

Brazil managed to up the pressure again at the end of the half but they lacked a killer touch against some full-blooded defending — Montiel even finished the game with his white sock soaked in blood.

When Brazil substitute Gabriel Barbosa fired a volley on target, Martinez was equal to it.

Messi slipped embarrassingly late on with a chance to clinch victory but it mattered little as moments later his teammates were tossing him in the air to celebrate their win.

and supported an insurgency in eastern Ukraine.

Two years later Moscow mustered an aggressive campaign to influence the US presidential elections.

During the same period, young North Korean leader Kim Jong-un embarked on an ambitious plan to develop nuclear weapons with missiles that could threaten the US.

Trump's 2017 National Security Strategy confirmed the pivot. "China and Russia challenge American power, influence and interests, attempting to erode American security and prosper-

"They are determined to make economies less free and less fair, to grow their militaries, and to control information and data to suppress their societies and expand their influence."

Reminiscent of the Cold War, the reorientation meant a Pentagon push to expand its navy, build stronger long-range bomber and submarine strike forces, and update its nuclear weapons.

It has also meant countering the Chinese and Russian challenge in new domains, with the Pentagon establishing both Space Command and Cyber Command.

The new priorities took root under Trump, and Biden con-

firmed them in March in his own national security policy.

"The distribution of power across the world is changing, creating new threats. China, in particular, has rapidly become more assertive," it said.

"Both Beijing and Moscow have invested heavily in efforts meant to check US strengths and prevent us from defending our interests and allies around the world."

Instead of Afghanistan and Iraq-Syria, Ukraine and Taiwan are the new flashpoints.

Both have recently received more and more advanced US weaponry to deter, respectively, Russia and China.

The Pentagon created a new office focused on China. US naval vessels regularly sail the waters around Taiwan and in the South China Sea, implicitly challenging China's territorial claims.

As for Russia, Biden has sought to strengthen bonds with NATO allies. Over the past week, too, US vessels took part in exercises in the Black Sea where Russian forces were conducting their own maneuvers.

Counterterrorism does not end with the Afghanistan pullout, the Pentagon stresses. But it is turning more remote-directed — using air and missile strikes from remote bases and vessels to act in Afghanistan where al-Qaeda still operates.

"We are repositioning our resources and adapting our counterterrorism posture to meet the threats where they are now," Biden said.
